includes 140 lessons that teach all the common phonics patterns in the traditionally accepted sequence allows teachers to provide hands on minds on activities in which children discover how words work while meeting requirements of systematic sequential phonics instruction

this guide provides need to know information for parents and professionals and answers frequently asked questions about dyslexia alan m hultquist addresses many of the issues surrounding dyslexia including possible causes and subtypes means of testing remediation and the controversial matter of staying back to repeat a school year

designed for teachers wanting to know what to do to help pupils with spelling difficulties this book combines practical advice with theory research and accounts of the author's own experience the author looks at how spelling skills develop in both young children and older pupils

when students are in elementary school a teacher who has expertise in teaching the fundamentals of reading instructs them at the middle and high school level that stops and the timing could not be worse the literacy demands increase

exponentially yet typically schools do not teach adolescents how to successfully read the increasingly difficult materials they encounter throughout their day as the rigor increases in their classes student coping skills become less effective consequently the achievement gap becomes wider and more difficult to close during the adolescent years when it comes time to prescribe an intervention middle and high school teachers are hitting a wall decoding and comprehension materials are often presented at an elementary level the students feel bad enough that they struggle with reading assigned baby work increases the stigma this book addresses the need for 6-12 teachers to have appropriate literacy intervention materials to use with struggling adolescent readers this book will also help teachers learn how to support any adolescent reader struggling or not when they encounter challenging text the book features two strands decoding and comprehension each strand contains lessons materials a difficulty dial tips for implementation and student samples
